U.S. Senate Candidate Bob Casey to Address 'Restoring America's Moral Compass' at Catholic University's Law School



WASHINGTON – **Bob Casey**, the Democratic party's nominee for U.S. Senate from Pennsylvania, will deliver remarks, "Restoring America's Moral Compass: Leadership and the Common Good," at The Catholic University of America Columbus School of Law on **Thursday, Sept. 14, 2006, at 3 p.m.**

A 1988 alumnus of the law school, Casey is Pennsylvania's state treasurer and currently is locked in a hotly contested battle with incumbent Republican **Rick Santorum**.

Casey's address is part of the law school's annual Pope John XXIII lecture series. Since 1965, the forum has invited outstanding professionals, academics, politicians and clergy to share their perspectives on a wide variety of social and theological topics. Former speakers for the lecture series include the candidate's father, former Pennsylvania Gov. Robert P. Casey; Cardinal Anthony Bevilacqua; noted Catholic scholar George Weigel; and former Supreme Court nominee Robert H. Bork.

A reception for the candidate will be held in the law school's atrium immediately following the conclusion of his remarks.
